



# STAYING APART TO STAY SAFE

The Impact of Visit Restrictions on Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Survey



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#### **Please Note**

The Office of the Seniors Advocate has produced and analyzed a number of cross-tabulations of survey survey results. We used cross-tabulations to understand how survey responses differed across different groups of respondents. For example, did visitors that were a spouse have different response patterns than those who were adult children?

Within this document, we have provided cross-tabulation results for long-term care residents/ visitors and assisted living residents/visitors in addition to overall (total) results. Within the main survey report, we occasionally reference cross-tabulation calculations that may not have been included in this document.
