### **Demographics**

- 21.8 years life expectancy at age 65 (1% → over 5 yrs.,
  1% ↑ over 10 yrs.)
- 343 per 10,000 seniors fatality rate (4%↑ over 5 yrs.,
   2%↓ over 10 years)
- Top causes of death for seniors over last 5 yrs.
  - o Cancer (24%)
  - Heart disease (19%)
  - Cerebrovascular diseases (6%)
  - o COVID-19 (6%)
  - Chronic lower respiratory diseases (4%)

#### Hospitalizations

- 8% $\downarrow$  in emergency room visits per 1,000 65+ (over 5 yrs.)
- **26%** of all emergency room visits are for seniors
- **5%** hospitalization rate per 1,000 65+ (over 5 yrs.)
- 47% of all hospitalizations are for seniors

#### **Alternate Level of Care (ALC)**

- **14%**↑ total ALC cases and days

### **Home Support**

- **10%**↑ in home support clients
- **4%** in avg. hours per client
- **7%** in client rate per 1,000 pop. 75+

### **Adult Day Programs**

- **6%** in Adult Day Program clients
- 21% in Adult Day Program days

### Over the last five years:

### **Assisted Living (AL)**

- 21% ↑ in waitlist for subsidized units
- 16%  $\psi$  rate of subsidized units per 1,000 seniors (75+)
- 2% ↑ in avg. care hours





### Over the last 5 years:

### **Long-Term Care (LTC)**

- 136% ↑ in clients waiting to be admitted (3,892)
- 54% ↑ in average time on waitlist (209 days)
- **12% \( \psi\)** in rate of LTC beds per 1,000 75+
- Clients are admitted 4 times faster from hospital than the community
- 17% ↑ in proportion of residents taking antipsychotics without a diagnosis of psychosis

#### **PharmaCare**

- **\$1.6 billion** spent on medication for seniors
- 69% of prescription costs covered by seniors and third-party insurance providers
- Remaining 31% covered by PharmaCare

#### **Health Human Resources**

- Active, registered health care employees increased in most professions
- Over the last 5 years:
  - Physicians 14% ↑
  - Nurses 10% ↑
  - Care aides **38%** 个
  - Physiotherapists 19% ↑
  - Occupational therapists 18% 个





### **Housing Highlights**

### **Property Tax Deferral**

- 80% of seniors are homeowners
- **50%** of seniors live in a single detached house
- **10,361** new users of the program **(13% ↓** over 5 yrs.)
- **\$4,767** avg. deferred (**17%** ↑ over 5 yrs.)
- **Est. 9%** of senior homeowners deferred their property taxes in 2022/23 (**76,847**)



### **Housing Highlights**

#### **Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters (SAFER)**

- 23,506 people receive SAFER (3% ↓ over 5 yrs.)
- \$20,800 avg. annual income of SAFER recipients (9% ↑ over 5 yrs.)
- \$1,116 avg. monthly rent for SAFER recipients
   (12% ↑ over 5 yrs.)
- \$198 avg. monthly SAFER subsidy (8% ↓ over 5 yrs.)

### **Housing Highlights**

### **Seniors Subsidized Rental Housing**

### Over the last 5 years:

- **6%** ↑ in units (1,764 new units)
- **58%**↑ in applicants (4,578 new applicants)
- **3% ↓** in units/1,000 pop. 55+

#### As of March 31, 2023:

- **11,549** on the waiting list
- **865** applicants housed
- 2.7-year avg. wait time for applicants waiting
- 90% ↑ in applicants waiting 5+ yrs.

### **Driving**

• 80% of seniors maintained an active driver's licence (19% ↑ over 5 yrs.)

- Median seniors income \$33,150 (16%↑ over 5 yrs.)
- Avg. seniors income **\$49,030 (12%**↑ over 5 yrs.)

### **Safety and Protection Highlights**

#### Over the last 5 years:

#### **Missing Seniors**

- **9%** ✓ reported to Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP)
- **16%** ✓ reported to Vancouver Police Dept. (VPD)

### **Seniors Abuse and Neglect**

- **35%** ↑ in reported cases of physical abuse 65+ (VPD)
- **53%** ↑ in reported cases of financial abuse 65+ (VPD)
- **15%** ↑ in complainants of property offences 65+ (RCMP)
- **55%** ↑ in victims of violent offences 65+ (RCMP)
- 114% ↑ in cases of abuse and neglect of seniors reported to Designated Agencies
- 110% ↑ in abuse related calls to Seniors Abuse and Information Line

#### Over the last 5 years:

75% ↑ in federal funding for new community-based projects for seniors

#### First Link©

- **13%** ↑ in clients
- **4% ↓** in client rate per 1,000 pop 75+
- **32%** ↑ in client contacts

#### **Better at Home**

- **18% ↑** in clients
- <**1%** ↑ in client rate per 1,000 pop 75+
- **52%** ↑ in services provided

### **Overall**

- Generally living longer and healthier lives
- Generally mobile and independent well into our 80's
- Affordability is an increasing issue for seniors
- Abuse, neglect, and policing data increases are concerning
- Some services are increasing, expenditures are increasing, but population growth is reducing overall access to most services
- Cost pressures on government will intensify over the next decade as the seniors age cohorts shift to 85+
