#### SUMMARY

## About the directory

- Standardized information on 293 publicly-subsidized residential care facilities in B.C. that care for almost 28,000 seniors at any one time
- Information includes:
  - Bed/room configuration
  - Information about food (funded food costs, food preparation)
  - Care quality indicators
  - Funded care hours



- This year's results of the OSA survey also included:
  - Opinions of 20,000 residents and their caregivers

### Facility profile

- 110 facilities with 8,814 beds are health authority owned
   183 facilities with 18,328 beds are contracted
- 73% of residents reside in single-occupancy rooms
  - 87% of rooms in residential care are single-occupancy, 9% are double-occupancy, 4% are multi-bed-rooms (3 or more beds)
- Health Authority owned and operated facilities
  - 54% of residents reside in single-occupancy rooms

#### Contracted facilities

- 82% of residents reside in single-occupancy rooms
- There are differences between contracted and HA owned and operated facilities in room configuration, client complexity, funded care hours, reportable incidents, substantiated complaints and use of therapies

### **Resident profile**

- Average age of residents 85 years
  - 59% are 85 or older
  - 5% younger than 65

### Cognitive profile

- 30% of residents have severe cognitive impairment (CPS 4+); higher in health authority-owned facilities
- **51%** have mild to moderate impairment and **19%** have no impairment

### Physical profile

• **30%** almost completely or completely dependant in activities of daily living (ADL 5+)

## Social engagement of residents

- Social engagement or involvement measured by the Index of Social Engagement (ISE)
- Almost half of residents had a low sense of social engagement (ISE 0-2 on seven point scale)
  - Similar across ownership types



ISE factors:

- At ease interacting with others
- Pursues involvement in the life of the facility
- Accepts invitations into most group activities
- At ease doing planned or structures activities
- Establishes own goals
- At ease doing self-initiated activities

### **Direct Care Hours**

Contracted facilities

#### B.C. average of 3.14 care hours per resident per day

- 15% of facilities meet the provincial guideline of 3.36 direct care hours
  - A 6% improvement from last year (9% meeting)



Health authority owned and operated facilities

- Funded for an average of **3.35** direct care hours
- 67% fall below 3.36 direct care hours

### Antipsychotics

25% taking antipsychotics without a diagnosis of psychosis, a 7% decrease from 2015/16



### Antidepressants

- 24% of residents diagnosed with depression
- 48% of residents prescribed antidepressants



### Daily physical restraints

8% of residents have daily physical restraints, an 11% decrease from 2015/16



### Access to therapies

- Residents have access to recreational, occupational, and physical therapy services
- On average in B.C.
  - 12% of residents received physical therapy
  - 29% of residents received recreation therapy
  - 8% of residents received occupational therapy



### Incidents

- Total of 4,629 reportable incidents in 2016/17
  - Slightly higher than 2015/16
- Rate per 100 beds is 17.4
  - A slight decrease from last year (17.5)
- The rate of reportable incidents is 24% higher in contracted facilities than Health Authority owned and operated

### **Substantiated Complaints**

- 181 substantiated complaints in 2016/17
  - 13% lower than 2015/16
- Decreased from 7.9 substantiated complaints per 1,000 beds to 6.8
- Substantiated complaints are 1.6 per 1,000 beds in Health Authority owned and operated and 8.9 per 1,000 beds in contracted facilities (356% higher)
- The conversion rate between a complaint and a substantiated complaint is 54% higher in contracted facilities

### Food

- 24% of facilities contract out food services, and 87% of facilities have their food prepared on site
- Average funded cost per day: \$8.00 per resident
- Wide variation in funded food costs across from facilities, from a low of \$4.92 to a high of \$18.44
